Applying for the Job: Tips from Local Arts Organisations!

"It's not always about what you know, but rather about what you'd like to know: Showing that you are thirsty for knowledge and experience will 100% make a difference. **There are a lot of people we hire because they are enthusiastic and ready to learn.**"

"If we see you at openings, artist talks, exhibitions, events etc. it helps us develop a personal relationship with you. When we have work opportunities and contracts, we will think of you for the job."

"We like hiring people who put the effort into getting to know us: Get involved in our committees, boards, juries etc. Not only does it show us you care about our organization, it also gives you insider info into when jobs will be opening up."

"There was a job that opened up at [our organisation] and when the call went out to fill it, we had some familiar faces apply for the position. These were people we had known for years in the community, that were friendly and bright, were involved in our orgs, and fulfilled every criteria needed. When we got to the interview process, we were surprised that some of them had a very cynical view of the arts. Don't get me wrong, having a realistic viewpoint of what the arts in Calgary look like is an asset, but being pessimistic and annoyed about it doesn't show that you're someone who wants to make a difference and improve things for everyone in the community. **It was someone who highlighted the positives of our community that got the job**."

These Webinars have two professional presenters speaking for 30 minutes each, followed by a 30 minute Q+A discussion with the registered participants. **These are free to CARFAC Members, but are \$25 per person otherwise.**

Student Memberships are \$40/year from the date you join, and are available at that price for 2 years after you graduate. Many students from AUArts are members of CARFAC Alberta.

Elephant Artist Relief Society (EAR) is a registered charity that provides practical resources to artists in the Calgary region in order to help sustain their well-being and livelihood and, in turn, contribute to a vibrant cultural sector.

As a unique service organisation, EAR builds creative capacity and fills a role not duplicated by any other agency. Originally dedicated to serving visual artists, the organisation has recently extended our programs to support artists of other disciplines, with intentions of meeting the broader community's needs for years to come. The society envisions a healthy arts community that ensures a continued rich cultural landscape for us all.

EAR came into being when a group came together to help a fellow artist with a health crisis. Since then, EAR has become evermore aware of how vulnerable artists are, when struck with an unexpected hardship. To achieve its goals EAR offers emergency financial relief, referrals and resources on topics such as health and safety, fiscal management and taxes, as well as hosting career development and entrepreneurship workshops.

About the A/P Gallery:

The A/P Gallery is dedicated to exhibiting innovative contemporary, print-based art produced by emerging, mid-career, and established artists that are available to the public.

Juried Programming:

Each year, A/P circulates a call for submissions for our regular juried programming that is open to artists working in a variety of print techniques that can include any or a combination of: relief, intaglio, monoprint, lithography, silkscreen and digital. These techniques can also be combined with any other media such as, but not limited to, fabric or ceramics. Our juried programming showcases regional, national and international artists working in a range of concepts and techniques. Exhibitions are chosen based on alignment with this Gallery Mandate, artistic and conceptual merit of work submitted, and feasibility within the Alberta Printmakers Main Space Gallery and A/P's goal is to provide opportunities for the artistic and public communities to experience the diversity of print media art as a contemporary and vital artistic medium.

Special Exhibitions and Community Exhibitions:

Within any programming year, A/P may also program additional printmaking exhibits, including exhibition opportunities for local emerging artists and for A/P members. Each year for example, A/P coordinates an international printmaking exchange entitled the Not So Mini Print Exchange and Exhibition that is open to local, national, and international artists of all experience levels working in print, which we feature in our Gallery during December.

About the A/P Studio:

A/P operates a fully equipped and staff-supported printmaking studio that serves both experienced and budding printmakers alike. The studio is equipped to accommodate a variety of contemporary and traditional printmaking techniques including:

- Etching & Intaglio
- Monotype
- Relief
- Letterpress (including typesetting, photopolymer, and hand-carved relief)
- Photopolymer plate-making
- Stone and Plate Lithography
- Silkscreen

A/P offers both in-person and online educational instruction for learning a variety of introductory and intermediate print techniques, and we have a popular Studio Rental program that provides independent studio and equipment access to support ongoing printmaking practices.

In-Person Workshops and Tutorials:

At this time, in-person classes and tutorials are not available due to public health measures, but keep checking back on our website and socials! A/P regularly offers in-person training on a variety of printmaking techniques using A/P equipment. These courses and tutorials are available to all experience levels.

Studio Rental Program:

A/P's studio rental program is open to all A/P members for a variety of rental periods and fees to suit your next project and budget. Familiarity with the safe use of equipment is required, and an understanding of safety practices within the facility.

Have questions? Contact us to learn more - we are happy to facilitate training and safety walkthroughs, and A/P membership is open to all members of the community.

Additional information for current art students:

A/P is dedicating to providing support to art students in the community outside of their institutional settings. A/P holds 2 seats on our Board of Directors for Student Representatives from AUArts and the University of Calgary to connect with you during and after your studies. Students are offered memberships at discounted rates (only \$10/year), and are welcome to attend our exhibitions and programming, and to participate in A/P's open calls, community activities, and volunteer opportunities.

- are a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident, or have refugee status in Canada (non-Canadians holding temporary work visas or awaiting permanent status are not eligible);
- are legally entitled to work in Canada;
- are between 16 and 30 years of age at the start of employment;
- are willing to commit to the full duration of the work assignment;
- will not have another full-time job (over 30 hours a week) during the Young Canada Works (YCW) work assignment;
- have been a full-time high school, college, CEGEP or university student (as defined by their educational institution) in the semester preceding the YCW work assignment; and

intend to return to full-time studies in the semester following the YCW work assignment.

These venues support the research, creation, and exhibition of socially relevant and politically informed creative practices from artists at all junctures of their careers, while enabling a public engagement with artist-run culture and contemporary art. TNG's programming comprises a broad range of art and educational activities, including exhibitions, publications, residencies,

offsite projects, and community collaborations that serve to invigorate audiences' experience of contemporary art and culture.
